During Earth Week, Alison ran a multi-school clean up of several local parks. Alison was a gold medallist at the 2007 Canada-Wide Science Fair, heads her soccer and hockey teams, swims and plays the flute. Alison plans to study nanotech engineering at University of Waterloo.

As one of 30 students selected as Loran scholars in 2009, Alison receives a Redknee Loran Award worth up to \$75,000 over four years of undergraduate study. Her award includes a \$8,000 cash stipend matched by a tuition waiver from one of 24 Canadian universities as well as \$7,500 in funding for three kinds of summer experiences: public policy, enterprise and personal/community development.

In addition, Alison will be matched with a community leader who will serve as her mentor during her time as an undergraduate and she will participate in as many as four three-day retreats for the more than 115 Loran scholars who are studying throughout Canada. Before heading off to university, she will join her fellow class of 2009 scholars for a five-day outdoor orientation in Algonquin Park, run by Outward Bound.
